From Fr. Jeider

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

As it was announced last week, I have been called to serve in a new ministry. In a few weeks I will begin a new chapter as a priest. I will be serving the ill, their families, and the caregiver team at Morristown Medical Center. Perhaps many of you are wondering the reason for this sudden change. The truth is that since our Lord Jesus came to the world He has been calling men and women to serve in his Church, and his holy people. It is he who calls us and empowers us to serve the needy, to carry his message of hope and love, to heal the sick, and pray for the needy. It is He who calls us to give our all for the little ones in the Kingdom of the Heavens.
